ABSTRACT:

Includes items pertaining to University of Alabama graduate, Zell George Herman, and his wife's, Maxcine S., Army and nursing training and educational pursuits.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE:

Zell George Herman attended law school at the University of Alabama before joining the Army in 1942, the same year that he married Maxcine S. Shores of Walker County. The couple eventually settled in Tallahassee, Florida.

SCOPE AND CONTENTS:

Includes items pertaining to Zell George and Maxcine S. Herman's army and nursing (respectively) training and educational pursuits. The collection includes items related to Mr. Herman's military career, interest in flying and communications and those items pertaining to Mrs. Herman's education and family memorabilia. Two plaques awarded to the Hermans, a copy of Benny Marshall's biography of Paul W. Bryant, *Winning Isn't Everything* (1965), and a sesquicentennial issue of the *Crimson White* are boxed separately.
