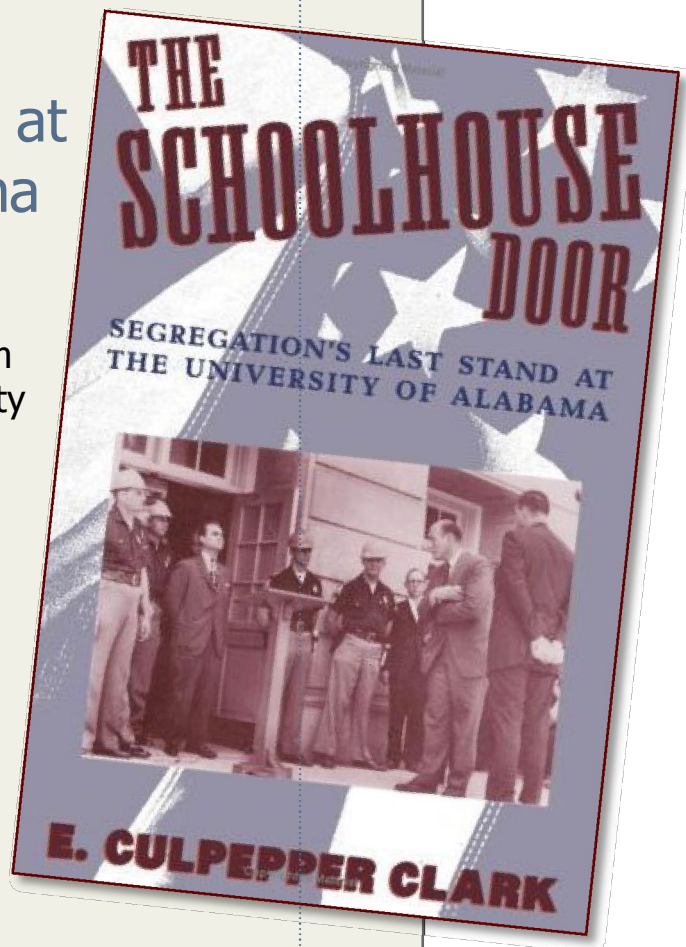
The Schoolhouse Door: Segregation's Last Stand at The University of Alabama
