The Evolution of Southern Religious Conservatism

Paul Harvey is a professor of History at the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs. Dr. Harvey holds a Ph.D. University of California, Berkeley and researches and writes in the field of post-Civil War American History. His particular interests include southern history, American religious history, popular culture, war and society, and the history of American music. He is the author of *Redeeming the South: Religious Cultures and Racial Identities Among Southern Baptists, 1865-1925*, published in 1997 by the University of North Carolina Press, and more recently *Freedom's Coming: Religious Cultures and the Shaping of the South from the Civil War through the Civil Rights Era*. He is presently working on a co-authored text entitled *Jesus in Red, White, and Black*, an exploration of the racialization of the divine through American history, as well as *Religion, Race, and American Ideas of Freedom: From the 17th Century to the Present*, to be published by Yale University Press.
